I am humbled to introduce myself as the new Chief Executive Officer of Penny Appeal Canada.

2023 was a difficult year for our Ummah. Natural disasters hit Turkey, Syria, Morocco, Libya, and Afghanistan. Sadly, thousands lost their lives. Even more continue to suffer the aftermath of the devastation. As the former Chief Development Officer, I oversaw these emergency responses, facing many obstacles and challenges. 

FEED OUR WORLD

The aim of Feed Our World is to fight hunger and malnutrition in crisis-hit countries, providing both short-term relief and long-term interventions. Feed Our World provides healthy meals to impoverished communities around the globe to thousands living in poverty and barely making ends meet, uncertain of where their next meal will be coming from - and that's where we step in. Through no fault of their own, thousands of people are victims of either war, drought, famine, displacement or natural disasters. Families ration meals and children go to bed with empty stomachs.

We deliver relief to communities in over 30 countries, providing them with nutritious food parcels, as well as sustainable long-term solutions. Our projects decrease the dependency and need for immediate food aid through the provision of skills training in livestock rearing and farming tools and technologies to address lack of food in the community throughout the year. No one should have to worry about when their next meal will be.



AQIQAH — LOCATION: MYANMAR

Agigah is an Islamic tradition where Muslims, on the occasion of the birth of a child, sacrifice livestock (sheep or goats) and, as a recommended act of charity, distribute portions of the meat to those in need.

Our Response:

You shared your family's joy with those in need across the world. Penny Appeal Canada was able to help source over 217 goats for sacrifice, which provided food to 16,599 families in Myanmar where food insecurity and poverty is widespread.

QURBANI — LOCATION: PAKISTAN, PALESTINE, INDIA, BANGLADESH, SYRIA, YEMEN, SOMALIA, TANZANIA, MYANMAR, ETHIOPIA

We honor the tradition of Prophet Ibrahim (AS) through the obligatory sacrificial slaughter of animals, known as Qurbani. There are a set of ethical principles that guide the procedure of the slaughter of 3 livestock and distribution of meat. Qurbani is conducted to distribute food to households in need who cannot afford to carry it out themselves.

Our Response:

Providing vulnerable food insecure families with fresh meat from the slaughter during Eid Al-Adha in 10 countries around the world.

LEBANON SEWING CENTER

Due to the deteriorating economic situation in Lebanon and increased concerns with domestic gender-based violence, with your support we were able to empower women including widows with vocational skills training to achieve financial independence through sustainable income generating activities.

Our Response:

The project supported:

- 25 marginalized women in Saida with a sustainable means of supporting themselves and their families through 6-months hands-on training on the use of the sewing kits, tailoring
- Provided all participants with sewing machines to kickstart generating income.
- Facilitating menstrual cycle awareness sessions for 80 women and adolescent girls.
- Provision of 2,500 reusable dignity pads to 320 vulnerable women in Akkar, north Lebanon.

ENHANCING FARM PRODUCTION

LOCATION: BANGLADESH

LIVELYHOOD IMPROVEMENT & **FOOD SECURITY**

LOCATION: RAMPAL - BAGERHAT, BANGLADESH

Our Response:

Bangladesh faces frequent disasters due to its geographical location, threatening millions of lives and livelihoods, especially in coastal areas like Rampal Upazila. This project enhances food security for vulnerable communities by creating sustainable livelihoods. Rampal has a population of 178,503, with agriculture as the main income source. Recent cyclones, compounded by COVID-19, have exacerbated vulnerabilities. To address these challenges, we initiated a project aimed at empowering 250 women through entrepreneurship training and financial support and access to microfinance opportunities.

Impact:

Formation of Self-Help Group with monthly meetings on generational saving and preparation and mitigation against climate change and disaster





FOOD SECURITY & PROTECTION OF LIVELIHOOD IN **FLOOD AFFECTED DISTRICTS**

LOCATION: PUNJAB, PAKISTAN

Our Response:

In response to the devastating floods in District Dera Ghazi Khan, particularly Tounsa, which disrupted food security and livelihoods, the project provided knowledge and training on climate-sensitive horticulture and livestock management to 700 farmers, enhancing their resillience against climate change.

Why we are doing it:

The flood-affected areas had been severely impacted by recurrent flooding, resulting in significant disruptions to the local community's food security and livelihoods.

Impact:

Restored the livelihood of 700 vulnerable farming famillies by building their capacities in livestock management and poultry rearing, their vaccination, and fodder distribution, as well as kitchen gardening trainings.

LOCATION: PALESTINE

The communities in Palestine and Jerusalem face unique challenges during the holy month of Ramadan. The economic toll and inflation that typically accompany Ramadan have a significant impact on the ability of families to provide for their basic needs, especially when it comes to the traditional iftar meal.

Our Response:

Our Ramadan initiative profoundly impacted the lives of 10,000 beneficiaries in Palestine and Jerusalem. By providing traditional iftar meals to those in Itikaf and the less fortunate, we not only met essential food needs but also strengthened community bonds and fostered a spirit of solidarity. Working closely with local partners ensured our efforts were impactful and sustainable, reflecting our deepseated belief in compassion and solidarity. Ultimately, our Ramadan project was a testament to our dedication to creating a more supportive and equitable society, where access to basic necessities like food is a right, not a privilege.

THIRST RELIEF

Reliable access to safe, clean water means that drinking, cooking, washing, watering crops, hydrating animals and making wudu no longer come with the threat of disease or threat to personal safety. It also allows women and children fetching water to do so with ease, instead of having to travel for miles, carrying heavy buckets of water. This saves them time and effort, giving them the chance to go to school, work or spend time looking after and being with their families.

Our Solar Water and Power Centres supply people with a reliable source of water right within their communities, so they no longer have to travel great distances to collect water or rely on questionable water sources for drinking and washing. Equipped with large water tankers, capable of holding mass quantities of water, these wells assure that freshwater is readily available for everyone throughout the community. People can easily pump water from the tank through a solar pump, eliminating any difficulty from the process of gathering water.

This year you helped Penny Appeal Canada provide safe access to clean water to communities in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Kashmir, Kenya, Somali and Pakistan.



CONSTRUCTION OF 5 SOLAR POWER WATER CENTERS

LOCATION: BANGLADESH

According to the Department of Public Health Engineering, less than 60% of the population in the south west coastal area of Bangladesh have access to safe drinking water with the existing water facilities. The rest of the population is forced to source their drinking water from contaminated sources.

Our Response:

Construction of sustainable standalone water solutions in the form of 5 SPWCs in Dumuria Shyamnagor Upazilas of the southwestern districts has helped

alleviate the water shortage and contributed towards reduced water-borne diseases amongst the population of these areas.

According to the UN and WB, only 28% of the population in Afghanistan use safely managed drinking water and the remaining 72% are at risk of using available contaminated water leading to several types of diseases and illnesses including AWD, cholera, and others. Vulnerable groups such as children and women are the ones exposed to water borne diseases more than others.

Our Response:

Supporting vulnerable population in Nangarhar and Baghlan Provinces with access to sustainable safe drinking water through construction of 5 solar power water centers.

SOLAR POWER WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM WITH RESERVOIR & A DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM

LOCATION: PAKISTAN

Ishaq Gujjo village is amongst the worst-affected villages of Taluka Chachro, in Tharparker, Pakistan in terms of severe water insecurity. The persistent droughts, resulting acute water shortages and increase in water prices make access to water incredibly difficult for the vast majority of the village population.

Our Response:

Construction of a sustainable standalone water supply system comprising 2 Solar Powered Water Centers, a 600 cubic feet communal reservoir as well as a metered distribution network to supply water to the village households.

PROVIDING ACCESS TO SUSTAINABLE WATER IN SANA'A

Our Response:

LOCATION: YEMEN

In Yemen, 16 million, including 8.47 million children, urgently need water, sanitation, and hygiene aid due to conflict and limited resources. Clean water is vital, yet many face challenges accessing it. The situation worsens with the risk of diseases like cholera. In northern Yemen, essential services are scarce, forcing women and girls to travel long distances for water, often risking their safety. Fuel shortages and import restrictions worsen the crisis, making many water sources unusable. Addressing water needs is crucial, especially for vulnerable populations affected by COVID-19, cholera, and malnutrition. Our project aimed to provide safe drinking water to over 11,200 people in the Sana'a district, bridging critical gaps in WASH services and promoting sustainable community solutions.

LOCATION: KENYA

Water is essential for human survival. Its absence, scarcity or contamination creates a situation of helplessness leading to search for this valuable commodity far and wide. The Tana River region is of critical importance when it comes to the livelihood of local communities. With droughts increasing over time, farmers and shepherds are no longer able to harness water for irrigating crops or feeding flocks, fisherman are also unable and maintain a livelihood through the usual means. Additionally, traveling far to collect water presents security and health risks for women and scarcity impacts sanitation and health outcomes of the community at-large.

Our Response:

Construction of 15 deep tube wells in Tana river county to secure a sustainable safe water supply.

2023 was tough year globally with several regions experiencing devastating damage and human displacement as a consequence of natural disasters.





TURKIYE & SYRIA EARTHQUAKE RELIEF

PHASE 1

LOCATION: TURKEY & SYRIA

On the 6th of February 2023 a huge earthquake struck Türkiye's southeastern border with Syria with a 7.8 magnitude. Other waves followed the initial earthquake including a 7.6 magnitude tremor that hit the same region. These earthquakes caused material and human loss as a result of the collapse of residential buildings.

Your donations helped reduce the suffering of affected populations in Syria and Turkiye by providing access to temporary emergency services and provision of immediate relief materials in the form of food, shelter, clothing and hygiene kits.

PHASE 2

LOCATION: HATAY

In February 2023, an earthquake in Hatay, Turkey triggered a severe humanitarian crisis, leaving tens of thousands homeless and in urgent need. The Province of Gaziantep, especially hit hard, faced not only physical destruction but also economic challenges. Thanks to your contributions, we responded to the devastating earthquake in Turkey by successfully providing dignified shelter to those who had lost their homes.

Our 'Hatay Container Homes Initiative' aimed to provide durable and secure shelter to victims, replacing makeshift tents. These container homes, equipped with all the basic amenities, offered a safe and stable living environment to the survivors of the earthquake. This project is a testament to our collective commitment to not only provide emergency aid but also to help rebuild lives with dignity and sustainability.

CYCLONE MOCHA RESPONSE

LOCATION: BANGLADESH

Cyclone Mocha made landfall in Bangladesh on the 14th of May 2023 as a category 4 tropical cyclone, bringing winds of up to 250 km/h, heavy rains, storm surges, flash floods, and landslides. More than 450,000 people were affected by the cyclone, according to the Department of Disaster Management. The storm has caused significant damage, with 2,358 households completely destroyed and 14,592 partially damaged.

Our Response:

Provision of immediate relief aid materials in the form of food, clothing and hygiene kits.

EARTHQUAKE RELIEF

LOCATION: SYRIA

Following a major 7.8 magnitude earthquake that hit Northwest Syria back in February 2023, a major need for basic food and non-food items was identified.

Our Response:

Provision of Family Emergency Kits, Hygiene Kits, Solar Lights, Water Purification Units, Water Purification Tablets, Emergency Food Kits, Food Hampers, Non-food Items, Medical Supplies, Essential Medicines.

YEMEN MOBILE CLINIC

LOCATION: AL-DHALE. YEMEN

Our Response:

In Yemen, the health system continues to deteriorate amid long-term conflict, with nearly half of health facilities non-functional or struggling to operate due to staff shortages and inadequate supplies. Lack of access to safe water and sanitation persists, exacerbating health challenges. Vulnerable groups, including women, children, and displaced persons, are disproportionately affected. Over 20 million people require health services, with chronic diseases and reproductive health needs posing significant risks. Migrants and refugees face additional barriers to accessing healthcare. The governorate of Al Dhale'e is identified as a critical area for health intervention due to ongoing neglect and vulnerability.

FLOODS IN LIBYA

LOCATION: DERNA

In September 2023, the catastrophic Storm Daniel unleashed havoc upon Libya, particularly devastating the eastern city of Derna, and triggering a substantial humanitarian crisis. The storm, which resulted in the collapse of two dams, unleashed a torrent of water that swept away entire neighborhoods, leaving thousands dead or displaced and an estimated 10,000 people missing

CYCLONE MOCHA EMERGENCY RESPONSE

LOCATION: MYANMAR

Cyclone Mocha made landfall in Myanmar on 14 May 2023 as a category 4 tropical cyclone, bringing winds of up to 250 km/h, heavy rains, storm surges, flash floods, and landslides. At least 41 people were killed in Sittwe Town, and over 400 killed in Rohingya IDP camps were rendered inaccessible. Winds have also flattened poles and trees, destroying camps for displaced Rohingya refugees and knocking off communication cables.

Our Response:

Provision of immediate relief aid materials in the form of food, medicine, tents, and hygiene kits.

Impact:

EMERGENCY RESPONSE IN EDLIB

LOCATION: SYRIA

As of October 5, Northwest Syria has experienced an escalation in shelling, affecting numerous localities, with Edlib City facing pronounced impacts. This violence has tragically resulted in the death of 7 individuals, including 2 children and a woman, and left 52 wounded, among which are 19 children and 12 women, as reported by UNOCHA.

Our Response:

- (1) Provision of immediate relief aid materials in the form of food, medicine, tents and hygiene kits.

EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE

LOCATION: MOROCCO

Our Response:

Over a 2-month period, Penny Appeal Canada collaborated with the Intermediaries to deliver emergency aid to Morocco's vulnerable populations living below the poverty line. This project focused on distributing food packs, water supplies, bedding, and non-food item (NFI) kits to needy families and hospitals. The initiative covered procurement and delivery of these essential items, with the Intermediary responsible for identifying beneficiaries through established criteria and sourcing supplies from vendors capable of meeting the project's demands.

RELIEF IN EIN EL HELWE

LOCATION: LEBANON

Ein El Helwe camp is the "country's largest camp in terms of both area and in population; an estimated 80,000 people reside in and around the camp, in an area of 1.5 square km" (UNRWA, 2017). On Thursday, 7th of September, 2023, armed clashes re-erupted after a month since the previous conflict, forcing families to flee into safer areas in the vicinity of neighboring Saida city.

Our Response:

Provision of immediate relief in the form of food items to support a family for at least one month, clothing. bedding and hygiene kits.

SYRIA CHOLERA RESPONSE

LOCATION: DEIR-EZ-ZOR, SYRIA

Our Response:

In August 2022, Syria faced a cholera outbreak, impacting regions such as Deir Ez-Zor, Idleb, Ragga, and Aleppo. With 56,879 suspected cases and 98 deaths reported, the affected areas experienced critical shortages of medical supplies, notably intravenous fluids. While NGOs responded by helping hospitals remain operational in Deir Ez Zor, some facilities reached full capacity and others lacked resources to manage the escalating cases effectively.

The Idleb Health Directorate had requested urgent assistance to address these pressing needs. Thanks to your donations we were able to support the hospitals to cope with the demand to treat the patients suffering from Cholera.

GAZA EMERGENCY RESPONSE

LOCATION: GAZA, PALESTINE

Since October 07, 2023, Gaza has been experiencing a severe humanitarian crisis. The situation is deeply concerning, with about 30,000 Palestinians killed of which over 15,000 are children, and around 70,000 injured

civilians. The situation remains dire as 1.7 million people have been forcibly displaced within Gaza, which is an enclosed piece of land, with an immense amount of restrictions imposed on the Gazan population directly exposing them to incredible amounts of danger.

We have received an outpour of support from all our donors which allowed us to initiate an immediate response providing a variety of relief items to the displaced and injured individuals, families, women and children,

hospitals and medical professionals. Having a unique Memorandum of Understanding with the Egyptian Red Crescent has allowed us to have direct access to the Palestinian Red Crescent, which has provided us and you with the transparency and trust in ensuring the aid is reaching the people of Gaza.

Our work is nowhere near done. In spite of all the challenges to ensuring relief is reaching the people of Gaza, we continue to work with our trusted partners on the ground to provide life saving essentials to those in most need. We would not be able to support the people of Palestine without your support and we count on you as we continue to prioritize this project in the next year.

VILLAGE RECONSTRUCTION IN PAKISTAN

LOCATION: MIRPUR KHAS, SINDH

In 2022, Pakistan faced the worst humanitarian crisis in its recent history, as heavy rains and flash floods ravaged the country. Over 218,000 houses have been destroyed and a further 452,000 damaged.

Livelihoods were heavily impacted – more than 793,900 livestock, a critical source of income for many families, was lost. Around 2 million acres of crops and orchards have also been impacted. Millions of people were trapped in floods, thousands have lost their lives and countless were rendered homeless.

You responded to our call for an immediate response and with the support of our partners, we provided the affected populations with life-saving emergency aid to help them shelter and survive during this challenging time. In the aftermath of the floods, when the water levels receded, we continued this project with the reconstruction of a village of 100 homes, which is now complete.



MOBILE CLINIC IN SOMALIA

LOCATION: SOMALIA

According to the WHO, Somalia is in a humanitarian crisis that is hampering it's development. Conflict along with food and water insecurity are having a severe impact on its population. Every 2 hours a mother dies due to pregnancy complications, every hour, 8 Somali children below the age of 5 die; one in 4 children suffers from chronic malnourishment. There is little to no access to primary medical care for mothers and children.

In response to the urgent needs, Penny Appeal Canada with your support, has successfully deployed a Mobile Healthcare Clinic in Somalia for the purpose of serving vulnerable populations in remote areas of Somalia. We have made an impact by reducing barriers to accessing healthcare with a mobile clinic that offers fully equipped solutions and reducing individual costs while prioritizing top-notch preventative health care with up-to-date technology.

NIGERIA FLOOD RESPONSE

LOCATION: NIGERIA

In 2023 almost all parts of Nigeria were affected by floods caused due to climate change. According to reports, about 603 people died, and more than 1.3 million were displaced, while over 108,393 hectares of farmlands were destroyed across the country.

Our Response:

Penny Appeal Canada, in partnership with Mannahelp, provided hygiene kits and food packs to individuals located in flood affected areas in Nigeria.

ORPHAN KIND

There are 153 million orphaned children worldwide, with 5,700 more becoming orphans every day. In 2022, more than 2.1 million people, including 934,000 children in the Gaza Strip, West Bank, and East Jerusalem are increasingly vulnerable due to the protracted crisis in the State of Palestine. In Pakistan, 4.2 million children are orphaned, the vast majority of them are below the age of 17. These children remain one of the most vulnerable groups in society.

Supporting the care and education of these vulnerable children and their families is crucial to bringing joy to their life and ensuring they have the opportunity to break out of the cycle of poverty and thrive.

Our Response:

Our orphan sponsorship program serves as a pivotal initiative for hundreds of orphans across Palestine and Pakistan, reflecting our dedication to empowering these vulnerable children.

Through OrphanKind we are deeply committed to breaking the cycle of poverty at its core by ensuring that the orphans of school-going age are not just attendees but active participants in their journey. We recognize that financial barriers should never stand in the way of a child's right to education. With a heart full of hope and hands ready to help, we supported 1750 young boys and girls, providing them with essential daily nutrition, covering the cost of education, school supplies, other essentials such as clothing, and psychosocial support. to pursue formal and quality education from the foundational years of kindergarten through to the pivotal secondary grades.

Thanks to you, this initiative is more than just a project; it's a promise to nurture potential, empower the next generation, and weave a tapestry of opportunity that stretches across communities, making every heart involved a part of something truly transformative.

ADDRESSING FOOD INSECURITY IN CANADA

There has been a consistent rise in food insecurity across the country. According to Stats Canada, in 2022, 18% of families in Canada, representing 6.9 million people, reported that they experienced some level of food insecurity over the past 12 months. Many communities including Indigenous, Black and several of Asian descent, as well as single mothers are disproportionately affected by food insecurity. Vulnerable individuals face several obstacles including, lack of familiarity with the available services, limited financial means to purchase healthy food, rise in costs and loss of employment.

With your generous donations, we have been able to address food security needs of Canadian Muslims and other vulnerable groups including refugees, newcomers, marginalized and racialized women, BIPOC communities, the homeless community, vulnerable students, and families in need.

THE PEOPLE'S MARKET At Home LOCATION: EAST TORONTO, SCARBOROUGH, ON CANADA

Our Response:

This program offers a dignified grocery store experience to individuals in need, ensuring they have access to essential food and supplies for their families. Through collaboration with our partners, we successfully introduced this innovative food bank model, benefiting our clients and the broader community.

KICK OUT HUNGER At Home

LOCATION: EAST TORONTO, SCARBOROUGH, ON CANADA

Our Response:

Penny Appeal Canada partnered with a grassroots organization providing food, winter clothing and hygiene items to the hungry - vulnerable populations in Durham region, Ontario. The items that were distributed amongst the beneficiaries included essentials to keep them healthy and safe over the winter months, these included warm meals, non-perishable grocery items, fresh produce, winter clothing, hygiene items, reusable bags and boxes.

Why we are doing it:

Penny Appeal Canada recognizes the difficulties faced by vulnerable minorities within Canada. According to durham.ca, 66,100 Durham Region residents do not have enough money to buy food. Being mindful of these stark realities we want to make it our foremost priority to invest in programming which help increase access to food security within vulnerable populations.

HOUSING & GROCERY SUPPORT

LOCATION: PEEL REGION, ONTARIO



Our Response:

Through this program, Penny Appeal Canada partnered with organizations providing youth support with transitional housing. Under this program, 20 youth were assisted with increased subsidy on transitional housing services as well as food security. The core objective was to enroll 20 additional youth in the Youth Rental Subsidy Program, where they received rental subsidies of \$400 per month during the months of January, February and March of 2023.

Why we are doing it:

Peel Region is in a homelessness crisis, and many of those experiencing homelessness are youth. Especially with the added challenges of Canadian winter, there is great need for urgent support to ensure that youth can be safely and rapidly re-housed and can remain healthy with adequate food supply. The Government of Canada's 2019 Shelter Report shows Peel Region having only 54 Youth shelter beds available. When considering that, 23% of the 922 homeless individuals surveyed in the Point In Time Impact:

count were youth, which is a dangerous gap. Alternatives are needed to ensure Peel housing supports for youth are sufficient to meet their needs.

THANKSGIVING At Home **GROCERY SUPPORT**

LOCATION: MISSISSAUGA, ON CANADA Our Response:

This program offers support to vulnerable families in MIssissauga support in the form of essential items for daily nourishment. Under this project we provided these families with a food basket consisting of staple food items, and a grocery gift card.

DOMESTIC WINTER RELIEF

NUTRITION FOR COLD WINTER DAYS

LOCATION: TORONTO, DURHAM REGION, YORK, PEEL, & HALTON

Our Response:

Penny Appeal Canada partnered with MCASS to provide 50 Afghan refugee families with food supplies for three months. The objective of this program is to provide nutrition for women and their children, facilitate access to healthy food and enable access to fresh halal and culturally sensitive food options. This program will additionally preserve the dignity of these families and alleviate the financial pressure experienced by refugee families.

Why we are doing it:

During the past year Canadians experienced a rise in the basic cost of living which included a drastic rise in the cost of groceries (food items). The Canadian Poverty Institute advised that racialized communities face high levels of poverty and 1 in 5 racialized families in Toronto live in poverty (compared to 1 in 20 for non-racialized families). The women we supported through this program were faced with the cold reality of struggling to provide food for their families.

OPERATION WINTER WARMTH

LOCATION: BRITISH COLUMBIA

Our Response:

Operation Winter Warmth was initiated keeping in mind the needs of new immigrant families in Abbottsford, BC. Penny Appeal Canada Partnered with Daughters of Eve Foundation in providing recently immigrated women and girls from BIPOC communities with winter clothing packages and warm soup hampers. The clothing packages included warm jackets, hats, mittens etc. Impact:

This project originated from a needs assessment based on an increased number of immigrant/refugee population, the complex nature of newcomers' adjustment needs, and many low-income and marginalized BIPOC women and girls in need. The challenges that these women and girls face are far-reaching and multidimensional, and therefore require interventions on a greater scope.

FOOD SECURITY THROUGH COMMUNITY HUBS

LOCATION: ONTARIO

Penny Appeal recognizes that low income populations are the most vulnerable to homelessness and hunger. A single person receiving Ontario Disability Support Program earns \$1228/month; people on Ontario Works are living in even deeper poverty. It is simply no longer sufficient for low income individuals and families, including those working at minimum wage, to meet costs for housing and food without charitable support.

In the GTA, there are now an estimated 20,000 people homeless every night. As a result of living in poverty, this community may not have access to sufficient financial resources to meet their fundamental requirements, which may include the purchasing of food, clothing, medication, personal hygiene or winter gear.



WINTER SURVIVAL KITS

LOCATION: ONTARIO

With your generous support Penny Appeal Canada provided winter survival kits for vulnerable members of the community, particularly the homeless community across the GTA. The kits contained 25 essential items for personal hygiene, winter gear, clothing and food items.



WARM LOVING HEARTS

LOCATION: CALGARY

Our Response:

Penny Appeal Canada provided funding to Bridges Association For Newcomers' Mental Health to support 100 low-income newcomer families with winter clothing to survive comfortably during the severe winter experienced by people in Calgary, Alberta. The clothing included winter coats, boots and winter kits (toque, mittens and socks).

Why we are doing it:

Winter weather in Alberta is known to reach as low as -40 degrees Celsius. Exposure to cold predisposes people, especially seniors and children, to infections like pneumonia. This program was initiated keeping in mind the low income populations, having limited financial resources to buy these essential items for their families.



Studies show that 20% of Canadians will experience a mental illness in their lifetime, making mental health and addiction problems a serious issue in Canada. Over the years there has been a noticeable increase in the number of individuals wanting to access mental health support within the muslim community. However, the current capacity of our Mental Health Services program is



PROJECT FALAH - MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT

LOCATION: BRITISH COLUMBIA

Penny Appeal Canada has committed to responding to mental health and addiction needs through Project FALAH. In an effort to address the serious challenges faced by the Muslim communities across Canada, particularly with a rise in Islamophobia, this program aims to support the community with training on guidance, accessing services, and resources for those recovering from addiction and mental illness.

- Mental-health awareness trainings with community leaders
- Mental-health counseling for individuals affected by Islamophobia
 - Creation of a database to access mental health support resources

COUNSELLING & MENTAL HEALTH

LOCATION: NOVA SCOTIA

There is an urgent need for active and careful intervention to support members of the Muslim community that have no existing counseling or mental health support groups dedicated to serving these minority groups in the region.

Impact:

With your support we were able to establish the first counseling and mental health support group for Muslim in Atlantic Canada. This program aims to create a platform for newcomer and refugee women in Nova Scotia, as well as the broader community experiencing alienation, domestic violence, racism, gender-based violence, Islamophobic attacks and hate speech.

CODING4CHANGE

LOCATION: BRITISH COLUMBIA

Our first cohort of Coding4Change successfully concluded this year with a 100% success rate. Coding4Change was designed to encourage BIPOC, Muslim, and women youth who engage with, enter, and excel in STEM - to enroll and undergo training and certification at no cost to participants. Participants developed specialized skills and credentials, and a fair chance to compete in the job market as professionals in computer programming and development.

Impact:

61 Muslims who can now integrate into the job market at competitive salaries (youth and adults from BIPOC, unemployed young professionals from marginalized communities, and youth looking for a career change)

ISNA CARES

LOCATION: GREATER TORONTO AREA

Individuals seeking support often face extended wait times, leading to delays in receiving critical care. Additionally, the absence of specialized services for specific demographics, such as religiously relevant care, children with disabilities and new mothers, has been identified as a significant gap in our support system.

Impact:

- Increase in access to mental health support to the young Muslim community
- Educating youth on the prevalent challenges, available resources and channels to access services and support.

ENHANCING COMMUNITY INTEGRATION AND ACCEPTANCE THROUGH EDUCATION

LOCATION: ADEN. YEMEN

Our Response:

Yemen faced a severe displacement crisis, with 4 million internally displaced persons (IDPs) as of 2021, ranking it among the top four globally. Aden hosted many displaced families, but challenges like social exclusion and limited access to education persisted. The conflict disrupted schooling, impacting 10.6 million children, exacerbating vulnerabilities like early marriage and recruitment into armed groups. Immediate action was crucial to support Yemen's displaced communities and safeguard its youth.
